The Mathers Orchid Foundation, Sylvan Nurseries, West Chiltington Road, Near Pulborough, RH20 2PR



The Foundation is a charitable organisation which aims to conserve orchid species and hybrids. It is at the cutting edge of orchid research in the UK and looks to encourage a greater interest in these plants. It holds the Plant Heritage National Collection of Oncidium and Pleione.

We have been given the opportunity of an exclusive 'Behind the Scenes' tour with Jim the Nursery Manager, better known to many of us as <u>Martin</u> Durrant (or, the nice man who sometimes displays huge pots of spectacular orchids on the stage at our Flower Shows).

Jim's work has been highly decorated during his career with many appearances at Chelsea Flower Show, the London Orchid Show and many other RHS Shows around the country, so he knows his onions (or should I say orchids). Jim's tour will be filled with lots of useful information on how they grow orchids at Mathers and you will be wowed by the 17,000 orchids in the collection, dazzled by the range of colours and flower forms and maybe even come away knowing the difference between an Oncidium and a Miltoniopsis.

The Old Vicarage, The Street, Washington, Pulborough, RH20 4AS

This is a great place to see a stunning display of Spring colour. Each year thousands of spring bulbs, including 2000 tulips, are planted in the 3½-acre garden, which is set around an 1832 Regency house (not open) in the pretty village of Washington. The garden has many wonderful features to see including mature and specimen trees, a Japanese garden, an Italianate gazebo, water gardens and numerous creatively planted herbaceous borders. Throughout the garden, there are well placed seating areas to take in the stunning West Sussex scenery. The treehouse is much loved by young and old alike, from here the nature viewing platform opens on to the woodland copse area which incorporates a stream and architectural stumpery.

Everyone loves the topiary of characters who watch over the tennis court. Whatever the weather, there is a haven in the conservatory where refreshments will be available.



Accessibility:

Mathers Foundation: Plenty of parking and is fairly easy for disabled access too.

Old Vicarage: Front garden suitable for wheelchairs. Rear garden on a slope. (A gator is available at own risk).

Mathers Foundation: None on site, but there are a number of places locally where you will be able to find a nice lunch. Further information will be provided nearer the day.

The garden has a great variety of trees, two greenhouses, shepherds hut, summerhouse, gravel paths, kitchen garden, many decks and wildflower terracing to the rear.

It is located in a very peaceful setting with great views.


Visitors can browse through an exclusive range of stalls within the on-site Market located in the cloisters.

Come and enjoy the panoramic views of the Kent and Sussex Weald, one reason why the Churchills chose Chartwell as their home.

You can visit the house on a free flow basis and we will pre-book tickets for you. Please note your interest in the house on the application form. On your self-guided tour of the house, you will get a feel for what life was like for the Churchills and their young family. You can admire the museum rooms filled with gifts to the Churchills and see the personal possessions that Winston and his family kept there. Don't forget to visit Winston's Art Studio which contains the largest single collection of his paintings.

Our visit will commence with a personal 1-hour guided walk with one of the garden volunteers who will tell us about the development of the garden and ongoing work. We will see the working kitchen garden with walls built by Winston, the formal rose garden designed by Lady Churchill and more.



The Golden Rose Avenue should be full of colour and fragrance, with catmint adorning the borders.

See if you can spot the inscription on the plinth reading 'Here lies the Bali Dove', Clementine's beloved pet dove that she brought to Chartwell from Bali in 1936.



Accessibility: Unfortunately, the house is not accessible to wheelchairs and only some areas of the gardens can be reached due to steps and steep gradients. A courtesy shuttle bus can take less able people from the ticket office up the steeply sloping path to the house and upper gardens.

Car Parking: £4 per car, but NT Members can park free by scanning your NT membership card at the machines in the car park.

Refreshments: Available at the café (opposite the Ticket Office), also in the garden tea room. Picnics are also acceptable.

Once a favoured medieval palace and then a Tudor royal residence, which in the 1930s was transformed by eccentric millionaires Stephen and Virginia Courtauld. Get a taste of the Courtaulds' extravagant lifestyle as you explore their unusual and stylish art deco interiors. There's a quirky mix of medieval and modern in the gardens too. Admire stunning herbaceous borders, walk through formal rose gardens and relax in the rock garden, with its pools and cascades running down to the moat.

There should be time to stop off at the award winning Polhill Garden Centre at Badgers Mount, which over decades has grown into an extensive shopping village, where you can browse the plants, outdoor living, ornaments & gifts and buy locally produced foods at the farm shop, or just relax and have a chat over a coffee and cake.

Eltham Palace: Most areas of the house are accessible by wheelchair, including the shop and café. There is a lift to the first floor for wheelchair users. There are extensive grounds and gardens with some changes in level.

Polhill Garden Centre: Accessible throughout.
